

Urgent incidental findings

When a radiologist spots an urgent incidental finding in a ZMBBI MR scan, they will immediately contact the PI of the study. The PI's name is on the report, and the PI's phone and email is in the Columbia directory. The radiologist will tell the PI the following info:

- the subject ID
- the incidental finding

The PI should then get the participant's name and contact info from their files or their team. They may either call the participant about the finding themselves, or pay an MD \$250 to research the finding, explain it to the participant, and contact the participant with recommendations about their next steps. Several MDs have agreed to reach out to participants with information about the finding and follow-up recommendations:

The PI should tell the MD the incidental finding, the participant's name, and the participant's phone number. This contact should be done via phone and not email, whenever possible, for HIPAA reasons. Ask if the MD can do this follow up call ASAP. If the MD is unable to make this commitment, contact the next MD on the list.
